

VVA, Veterans Victorious in Lawsuit Over Military's Chemical Testing Program

(Washington, D.C.)---- "Six and a half years ago, in an unprecedented legal action, Vietnam Veterans of America, along with San Francisco-based veterans organization Swords to Plowshares, joined with half a dozen veterans who 'volunteered' to participate in experiments that tested chemical and biological agents," said John Rowan, VVA National President.

"Our law firm, Morrison & Foerster, was informed yesterday that a three-judge appellate panel in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals had affirmed an injunction ordering the U.S. Army to provide all former test subjects with any newly acquired information about the substances to which they were exposed and which might impact their health. The panel also concluded that the military still has an obligation to provide the test subjects with medical care.

"We are heartened by the court's affirmation of our position," Rowan said. "Agencies of government can no longer ignore the complaints and questions of veterans who may have been harmed after having participated in the testing of more than 400 chemical and biological substances, including hazardous agents such as sarin and mustard gas and mind-altering drugs, including LSD."

The testing program, which was centered in Maryland at Edgewood Arsenal and at Fort Detrick, was conducted at military installations throughout the nation, from Natick Laboratories in Massachusetts to Fort Ord in California. The highly secretive program, which involved the CIA and the Department of Defense, along with other branches of the military, spanned more than five decades.

The late Gordon Erspamer, then a litigation partner in the San Francisco office of Morrison & Foerster, explained why his firm had taken on a pro bono basis, the lawsuit: "Until this case is concluded, and all the victims are found and made whole, we cannot close this sad chapter in our history, when our government exploited the very citizens . . . it was supposed to protect."

Senators Moran and Blumenthal, Representatives Benishek and Honda Introduce New Toxic Exposure Research Act of 2015

(Washington, DC) -- "It's bad enough that veterans have had to bear the cross of exposure to toxic agents during our military service," said Vietnam Veterans of America National President John Rowan. "It is worse to see our children and grandchildren afflicted with health conditions we suspect have derived from our exposure, and to think we are the cause of their hurt and pain. Today, however, we see real light at the end of a long, grim tunnel with the introduction of the 'Toxic Exposure Research Act of 2015.' This legislation, when enacted, will establish within the Department of Veterans Affairs a national center for research on the diagnosis and treatment of health conditions of the descendants of veterans exposed to toxic substances during their service," Rowan said

"VVA is gratified that this is a bipartisan effort in both houses of Congress," Rowan emphasized. "We applaud Senators Jerry Moran (R-KS) and Dick Blumenthal (D-CT), and Representatives Dan Benishek (R-MI) and Mike Honda (D-CA) -- and their energetic and committed staffs -- for introducing S. 901 and H.R. 1769. We will pull out all the stops to work with them in seeking additional co-sponsors for this very necessary legislation. And we will work with our fellow veterans service organizations, military organizations and associations, and others to move these bills through the legislative process and into black-letter law."

"This bill isn't only about the herbicide Agent Orange and other chemicals used in South Vietnam," Rowan pointed out, "It's about exposures to chemical agents for all who have served in our Armed Forces, including those exposed to the toxic fumes released by the U.S. Demolition Operations at the Khamisiyah Pit and those exposed to the toxic fires from burn pits across Afghanistan and Iraq during Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom and New Dawn."

Rowan noted that a key part of this legislation is the establishment of an advisory board that will oversee and assess the work of the center, to determine health conditions in a veteran's offspring that likely result from the veteran's exposure, and to study and evaluate cases of exposure.

Congress on Tuesday approved plans to offer new veteran ID cards to honorably discharged service members, in an effort to more easily prove their military service.

The measure passed through the Senate and House without objection, but took several years to get through Congress. The Obama administration has expressed reservations about the need for the new IDs, but has not threatened to veto the legislation.

The measure, sponsored by Rep. Vern Buchanan, R-Fla., would create official VA cards for all veterans, instead of only those who qualify for certain health care and financial benefits.

Supporters called it a simple move to honor the sacrifice and service of veterans.

"This legislation will assist veterans in proving that they are indeed veterans," said Rep. Mark Takano, D-Calif. "The majority of service members leave before retirement ... and are sometimes challenged to provide proof of their honorable service. This is a simple way to resolve this issue."


The cards would not replace medical IDs or official defense retiree IDs for veterans, and could not be used as proof of eligibility for obtaining federal benefits.

But they would serve as easy proof of military service for many veterans who complain they have to carry around copies of their discharge paperwork to get discounts or services at a host of private businesses.

Buchanan argued that practice is at best cumbersome and at worst unsafe, given the personal information included on those official documents.

Veterans requesting the IDs would have to pay a small fee, to be determined by Veterans Affairs officials. That fee would cover the cost of the program.

The measure heads to the White House to be signed into law. No time frame has been established for when the first ID cards might be issued.
